Admission Rules for UG & PG

- ▶ Candidates and their parents or guardians must read all instructions given in the prospectus carefully and submit a complete online application form to the admission committee.
- ▶ The candidates have to fill up the particulars in the prescribed admission forms.
- ▶ Admission will be strictly on fulfilment of eligibility criteria.
- ▶ Any gap in the academic career of applicant must be supported by an undertaking/affidavit by the candidate.
- ▶ A student must produce original certificates at the time of admission.
- ▶ Rules for admission are subject to change as per university's notification from time to time.
- ▶ Candidates coming from Boards/Universities other than HP Board of School Education, Dharamshala/ H.P.U. Shimla, must produce original migration certificate.
- ▶ A candidate **having compartment** in 10+2 (or B.A./B.Sc. 3rd year) in any subject **is not eligible** for seeking admission in B.A./B. Com/B.Sc. 1st semester (or M.A./M.sc. 1st semester).
- ▶ Admission of a student will be liable to cancellation if he/she furnishes incomplete/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will be taken against such candidates.
- ▶ Girl students seeking admission in any class must bring an attested copy of HP Bonafide certificate for tuition fee-concession.
- ▶ Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission.
- ▶ Student seeking exemption from fee and funds for disability must attach an attested copy of at least 40% disability certificate.
- ▶ Students who have been expelled or rusticated from any institution will not be eligible for admission.
- ▶ Student from National Open School will be eligible only if they are passed in all five subjects including English (applicable for UG 1st semester students only).
- ▶ All admissions are provisional and subject to final approval of University concerned.
- ▶ A student can migrate from one college to another in accordance with the rules laid by the University.

Some More Rules for Admission in PG

1. Admission Procedure

Admission to all PG courses will be based on the marks obtained in the entrance test conducted by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla. All candidates seeking admission to M.A./M.sc. at Govt. P.G. College Chowari must apply to Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, for the entrance test according to the HPU schedule. After the results of the entrance test are declared by HPU, applicants must apply to the college for admission and present themselves for verification of original documents on the counselling date and time set by the college. The list of selected candidates will be displayed on the college notice board and website. Selected candidates must deposit their dues within the notified time; otherwise, their admission will be cancelled, and the vacant seats will be allotted to the next candidates on the merit list.

2. Basis of Admission

The admission will be made purely on merit, except where otherwise mentioned, subject to the limitations of available seats and reservations. The minimum qualifying marks for the Entrance Test will be 35% (in case of SC/ST candidates, the minimum qualifying marks shall be reduced until the full SC/ST quota for admission has been exhausted) for calling the candidates for Interview/Admission. The following are the eligibility conditions for admission to various courses, provided further that for admission, marks of 0.5% and above should be considered equal to 1% marks (Notification No. 4-9/94-HPU-Acad. dated 27-6-1995).

2.1 Eligibility for M.A. in Political Science/Hindi and M.Sc. Chemistry

A Bachelor's degree of a University established by law in India, with the subject of PG as one of the subjects, with a minimum of 48 credits in Major subject, 48 credits in two minor subjects, 9 credits in compulsory, 1 credit in GE and Hobby with aggregate of 106 credits/132 credits under new system for the award of pass degree

or

Bachelor's degree of a University established by law in India (with the subject of study for M.A./M.Sc. as one of the subjects) in 2nd Division or with at least 45% marks (40% in case of SC/ST candidates) or Honours in the subject concerned.

3. Age Limit

1. The upper age limit for admission to the MA and M.sc. first semester is 26 years for male candidates and 28 years for female candidates as of 1st July 2026.
2. An age relaxation of 3 years is permitted for SC/ST candidates.

3. The Vice-Chancellor of Himachal Pradesh University can grant age relaxation for a maximum period of 3 months in special cases.

Note: Candidates who have qualified in the Entrance Examinations conducted by HP University Shimla will be considered in the first counselling at this institution. HP University's rules will apply if any seats remain vacant.

Procedure for Online Admission in UG and PG

1. Read the instructions thoroughly as given in the prospectus.
2. Keep soft copies of following documents with you:
 - (a) passport size photograph.
 - (b) Signature specimen.
 - (c) Matric and 10+2 certificates.
 - (d) Character certificate (not more than 6 months older) from the head of the institution last attended (original character certificate to be uploaded with the admission form. For gap cases, character certificate from Panchayat Pradhan / Gazetted Officer along with self-declaration for the gap earlier). *(Only for candidates seeking admission in 1st semester of UG or 1st semester of PG)*
 - (e) SC/ST/PH/Sports/PwD/EWS/WFF/IRDP/BPL/Ward of Ex Serviceman/Cultural Certificates (if applicable).
 - (f) Bonafide Certificate for Himachali girls/J&K students.
 - (g) Photocopy of Aadhar Card.
 - (h) Photocopy of bank account number.

4. Register yourself by paying a fees of ₹50 and then by creating login ID (your working e-mail ID) and password and then proceed to fill in the online admission form.
5. Upload your photograph, signature and the required documents (original scanned and clearly visible documents).

National Education Policy (NEP) 2020

In pursuance of the Notification No. EDUA-009/7/2025-278440-NEP dated April 1, 2026 issued by the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Himachal Pradesh and Letter No. 7-1/2025-HPU (Acad) dated April 18, 2026 sent by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, the Government Post Graduate College Chowari shall implement the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 for all students admitted to the 1st Semester from the academic session 2026–27 onwards. The NEP framework envisages a holistic, student-centric and multidisciplinary approach to higher education with emphasis on flexibility, skill enhancement and multiple entry and exit provisions.

► Programme Pathways

After semester II a student may opt for:

- Single Major Programme
- Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary Programme

Note: Once chosen, the Major/Minor combination continues till Semester VI.

► Important Academic Guidelines

- Students study **three subjects (A, B, C)** in Semester I.
- Minor subjects are derived from initial disciplines studied.
- **Multidisciplinary Courses (MDCs)** must be from outside Major/Minor disciplines.
- **Skill Courses (SEC)** include both discipline-specific and open options.
- **Language Courses:** Maximum two allowed as Core/Minor.
- **Internship (IAPC)** is introduced early for practical exposure.

These guidelines ensure **flexibility with academic depth.**

Structure of Courses under NEP 2020 (Offered in Semester I and II only)

1. **Core Course:** A course which should compulsorily be studied by a student as a core requirement is termed as a Core course. 2 Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Courses of 2 subjects (1 per subject) will be taught in both the semesters to the students. The course designed for papers under this category aims to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline.
 - In Semester I and II, students have to study DSC courses of their chosen Major discipline.
 - These courses are compulsory and form the foundation for advanced learning in subsequent semesters.
 - Each DSC course will be of 4 credits.
2. **Minor Course (MC):** Minor Courses are taken from a discipline other than the Major. These courses enable students to gain additional knowledge and develop competency in a secondary area of interest. A student has to study one minor course also in each semester from a pool of minor courses available to him/her.
 - In Semester I and II, students opt for one Minor subject and study its courses alongside the Major.
 - Each minor course will be of 4 credits.
3. **Multi-disciplinary Course (MDC):** Multidisciplinary Courses are designed to provide exposure to disciplines other than the student's Major and Minor subjects. These courses promote broad-based learning and interdisciplinary understanding. A student has to study

one multidisciplinary course also in each semester from a pool of such courses available to him/her.

- MDC will be different from Discipline Specific Core courses and Minor courses and student must not have studied that course at 12th level.
 - Each MDC will be of 3 credits.
4. **Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):** Skill Enhancement Courses of each subject aim at developing practical and technical skills related to that subject. A student has to study one SEC in semester I and II from the offered subjects. Each SEC will be of 3 credits.
 5. **Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):** Ability Enhancement Courses are aimed at improving language proficiency, communication skills and foundational competencies. A student has to study one AEC in semester I from the pool of ability enhancement courses provided by the college. An AEC will be of 2 credits.
 6. **Internship / Apprenticeship / Project / Community Outreach (I/A/P/C):** This component is designed to provide experiential learning through internships, apprenticeships, project work or community engagement. It helps students apply theoretical knowledge in real-life situations and enhances their employability chances, practical exposure and social responsibility. A student has to compulsorily do any one out of internship, apprenticeship, project or community outreach at the end of second semester. This will be of 4 credits.
 7. **Value Added Course (VAC):** Value Added Courses are introduced to impart value-based education and holistic development. A student has to study one VAC in semester II. These courses may include areas such as ethics, human values, digital awareness, health, or environmental consciousness. It will be of 2 credits.

1. The prescribed credit weightage includes Lecture, Tutorial, and Practical components.
2. In the first semester, students will be offered three different subjects within the same stream: A,B, and C (Core and Minor are provided here for illustrative purposes only).
3. At the end of the second semester, each student may choose one of two programmes: the Multi-Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary or Single Core Discipline (Major) programme. The student choosing the latter will be required to give his/her Major and Minor at the end of the second semester. Such choices, including DSCs made at the end of the second semester, shall remain in effect until the VI semester. The prescribed credit weightage includes Lecture, Tutorial, and Practical components.
4. The DSCs of another discipline for the first two semesters of students who opt for Major programmes will be treated as Minors.
5. A DSC offered in one discipline will be treated as a Minor by another. Students can choose Minor Courses from two different subjects, but must earn a minimum of 12 credits in each.
6. MDCs must be selected from a broad discipline/pool of MDCs other than Major and Minor disciplines/subjects and must not have studied that course at the 12th level.
7. AEC/VAC/SEC-3 should be chosen from a pool of courses. Every discipline shall provide these courses, some of which will be offered discipline-specific, while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines. However, the two SECs (SEC-1 & SEC-2) must be chosen from the discipline-specific (Core and Minor).
8. A maximum of two language courses can be opted for as Core and Minor. AECs should be in a language other than what is studied in DSCs/Minors.
9. I/A/P/C will be determined at the end of the first semester to enable students to carry out some I/A/P/C activities during winter vacation.
10. To pursue an Honours & Honours with research in the 4th year, students shall study one discipline in which s/he has studied at least 11 core courses (6 DSCs + 5 DSEs) in the first three years.

11. A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till semester 6 (up to a 3-year degree) shall be eligible for a 4-year degree Honours with Research, provided HPU has approved the college to offer it.
12. One course per semester (DSC/Minor/MDC/SEC/etc) from a subject offered in two (or more) different programs (e.g. BCA and BSc/ BPA and BA/ BFA and BA/ Shastri and BA/etc) must be the same.
13. Students in the BA programmes can opt for only one DSC each from the Bachelor of Performing Arts (Dance, Music, Vocal & Instrument/Tabla/ etc.) and the Bachelor of Fine Arts (Painting/Applied Arts/Sculpture/ etc.).
14. Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfilment of the following conditions: For Major, 64 credits in a 3-year & 84 credits in a 4-year UG programme in a single Major Discipline. For Minor, 28 credits in 4-year UG programme in a single Minor Discipline.

****As this scheme is being introduced for the first time, it is subject to modifications. Any changes applied in subsequent years after admission to the 1st Year will be retrospectively applicable.***

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

Pursuing the aim to enhance and give boost to enrolment in Higher Education, University Grant Commission has proposed Rashtriya Uchta Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA). Under this programme, the CBCS has been introduced with a vision to enhance the quality of education. The new UGC CBCS system has been approved and adopted by the Department of Higher Education and H.P.U Shimla beginning from session 2018-19 and the admission for the session 2026-27 in **2nd and 3rd year** will be in accordance with this system.

Outline of Choice Based Credit System

1. **Core Course:** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course. 4 Discipline Specific Core Courses (DSC) (2 per subject). The purpose of fixing core papers is to ensure that all the institutions follow a minimum common curriculum so that each institution/university adheres to common minimum standards. Also, the course designed for papers under this category aims to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline.
2. **Elective Course:** Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
 - 2.1 **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course** (2 each for regular courses): Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
 - 2.2 **Generic Elective (GE) Course** (2 each for B.A. /B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.
3. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses are of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

- 3.1 **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication.
- 3.2 **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)** (4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.
4. **Practical/tutorials** (One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper): The list of practicals provided in the draft of CBCS is suggestive in nature and each university has the freedom to add/subtract/edit practicals from the list depending on their faculty and infrastructure available. Additions will however be of similar nature.

Credit Scheme

1. An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core courses each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core courses each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 courses each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective courses based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two courses from the list of Generic Electives courses.
2. An undergraduate degree in science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 core courses each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 courses each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective courses based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.
3. For the purpose of computation of work-load the following mechanism may be adopted:
 - (a) 1 Credit = 1 Theory period of one hour duration per week.
 - (b) 1 Credit = 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration per week.
 - (c) 1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two-hour duration per week.

1. Eligibility for Admission in B.A. 1st/B.Sc. 1st/B.Com. 1st Semester

1.1 Age Limit

Maximum age limit for admission to B.A./B.Sc./B. Com. courses is 23 years for male candidates who belong to the general category and 25 years for girls as on 1st July 2026. A relaxation of 3 years is applicable to candidates belonging to SC/ ST category. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of 6 months.

Important

The principal of college will have the right to refuse admission to a candidate during the session on grounds of ragging, indiscipline, misbehaviour or bad conduct including unruly acts and non-observance of code of discipline.

The admission for 2nd and 3rd Year will be as per University/Govt. Notification

1.2 Academic Qualification: A student must pass in the senior secondary (+2) Examination conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education, C.B.S.E. or an examination accepted as equivalent by HP University:-

- (i) provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. 1st semester
- (ii) provided that candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com 1st semester
- (iii) provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Arts Stream shall be given preference in admission to B.A. 1st semester
- (iv) For students who have not passed 10+2 in Commerce stream and seeking admission in B.Com. 1st semester, he/she must have studied either Mathematics or Economics at 10+2 level

- (v) The students who want to take Mathematics as Core Course must have studied and passed Mathematics paper at 10+2 level with minimum of 45% marks

The candidates applying for science stream should have passed 10+2 Examination or its equivalent from recognized Board/University with any of the three subjects out of Physics, Chemistry, and Biology or any other science subject with 50% or equivalent grade and for SC/ST candidate the required eligibility will be 45% or equivalent grade.

Note: Modification in NEP-2020/CBCS is subject to change as per Government Notification and University Guidelines, if any amendment is made in the near future by Government/University, then that shall be implemented.

2. Eligibility for the Degree

- 2.1 A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a College affiliated to the H.P. University for a period of not less than six academic semesters (three academic year for Annual System students) and not more than fourteen academic semesters (five academic years for Annual System students) and pass the examination and fulfil such conditions as have been prescribed.
- 2.2 The student shall be eligible for degree through **regular mode only**.
- 2.3 For the degree of B.A./B.Sc./B. Com, the student will have to earn minimum of 128/168 credits (3/4 years programme in NEP) in a minimum of six semesters and a maximum of fourteen semesters from the date of admission. it will be 132 credits hours in a minimum of three and maximum of five years in CBCS (Annual) system.

3. Choosing Programme Study Courses

- 3.1 At the time of admission, each student will identify two Core (main) subjects in which he/she will concentrate and a minor (allied) elective subject which he/she would choose to study.
- 3.2 Core subjects once identified would not be changed unless the student quits a programme and joins a new programme.
- 3.3 In these subjects, the student will be required to accumulate a certain minimum number of credits in order to qualify for the UG degree.
- 3.4 The degree of the student will be awarded as B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com. on the basis of the faculty.

► The DSE courses 304 to 306 (Semester III) and 403 to 405 (Semester IV) are internal choice based. The students have the choice to select any one of them respectively or opt for a dissertation or project work. The course 305 (Research Methods and Research Ethics) is essential for the students who wish to opt for dissertation or Project work in Semester IV. Supervisor for the dissertation or project work will be internal. The course adds to the values of research ethics, value neutrality, intellectual property, skills of data collection and interpretation, publication ethics and researcher's responsibilities. The IA part of the courses helps in developing among students the communication and writing skills, leadership quality and debating. The courses 101 to 103 and 401 help the students to have conceptual clarity, develop individual perspectives, analytical approach, communication, debating and negotiating skills. Courses 104 and 203 inform the students about institutional roles, performances, and train them how to access and utilise the legal, constitutional and power processes. Courses 302 and 401 develop among the students the policy analysis and application skills and increase their knowledge about the international legal institutions, processes and the order. The dissertation part and IA based on assignments and presentations add to the data organisation, analysis, reporting, writing, communication and presentation skills among

the students.

► AEC-POLS-307 is a qualifying paper which will be conducted by the Department itself. It will be mandatory for all the students to pass this course for the award of the degree of M.A. in Political Science. The marks of this paper will not be counted in the overall CGPA of the students. Question paper setting for AEC (Ability Enhancement Course) will be external under the aegis of the COE. However the evaluation will be internal to be carried out at departmental level.

2. Library

The college is equipped with a well-stocked library to support the academic needs of students. The library holds a total of 10,601 books, with 10,491 books dedicated to Undergraduate (UG) classes and 110 books for Postgraduate (PG) students. In addition to the extensive collection of textbooks and reference materials, the library subscribes to 6 newspapers and 12 magazines.

For convenience, the college offers two self-service kiosks, allowing students to easily access information about available books without needing to visit the library in person. Additionally, the college also runs the Dr. Radhakrishnan Book Bank, a special initiative aimed at supporting students from economically weaker backgrounds. The Book Bank provides 283 books to eligible students for the entire academic year, free of cost.

3. Leave Rules

(i) Student can avail leave with prior permission after properly applying for leave on prescribed leave form.

(ii) A tutor can recommend leave up to 3 days. A student must get application signed by senior tutor for leave up to 7 days.

(iii) Leave during house examination will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendation of senior tutor.

Co-Curricular Activities in the College

1. Eco-Club Basodan

Environment is indispensable for any living organism and it is a sole responsibility only for human being to save and preserve it for future generation. Therefore, our college has an Eco Club “BASODAN” sanctioned by the State Science and Tech. Dept., H.P. is working in the college to encourage activities like afforestation, sanitation, environment sustainability, conservation, garbage disposal etc. Students participate and create awareness through various activities like poster making awareness campaigns etc.

2. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The college has one unit of NCC. The officer commanding 9 HP BN NCC, Dalhousie Cantt. has sanctioned one NCC platoon to the college. NCC cadets will be selected by the Staff of 9 HP BN NCC, Dalhousie Cantt. as per the enrolment rules passed by DG NCC. Total No of sanctioned vacancies are 106 (SD & SW).

3. Annual Prize Distribution Function

Annual prize distribution function will be held during end of the session. Prizes will be awarded to those students who show excellence in the field of Academic, Sports, Cultural, NSS Rovers and Rangers NCC Red Ribbon Club and other activities on the basis of rules framed for prizes. One memorial trophy Sh. R.R. Awasthi is given to the sports with excellency in academic session.

4. National Service Scheme (NSS)

The national Service Scheme is currently comprising of 100 volunteers. The enrolment is made by Programme Officer on the basis of selection. In every academic session our students participate in number of social programmes organised in the college and outside the college.

5. Tutorial Groups

Every student is assigned as tutorial group which normally consisted of 40-50 students. Each group is guided by a member of the faculty who is their tutor. The students have to seek advice of their tutor for all problems. They have to get their identity card signed by the concerned tutor/senior tutor. Identity cards must be complete in all respects within 15 days after admission.

6. Red Ribbon Club

In order to raise awareness level regarding the dreaded HIV/AIDS, blood donation, drug abuse and other related issues, the college has framed Red Ribbon Club.

7. Rovers & Rangers Units

The Bharat Scouts and Guides is a registered society under Societies Registration Act. It is a voluntary, non-political and secular organization. It is largest youth movement. The college has two units of this organization. The objective of the units is to create in each student the qualities of personal dignity, poise graciousness and social maturity.

8. SVEEP

Govt of India has started a special programme to enhance the voter awareness and knowledge about election system of our country and register new voter in the voter list, to update address, photo and other credentials. This programme is called Systematic Voter's Education and Electoral Participation and under SVEEP programme our college has also created a SVEEP Club to achieve above mentioned aims.

9. Disaster Management Cell

Disaster Management Cell is also created in our college to and aware train students about different types of disasters. In every academic session students participate in different awareness, training and mock-drill programmes.

10. College Magazine

College is a platform for creative buds to recognize their talent and to provide them a forum for the manifestation of their creativity, the College has a magazine "VAGEESHA" named after Goddess Saraswati is brought out annually. The magazine has eight sections. Each section is edited by the member of the staff and is assisted by a student editor. Interesting

students can approach the Editorial Staff for any guidance in this regard, so that their original thoughts and creativity can be presented in the right section of college magazine.

11. **Career Guidance & Counselling Cell**

After passing a secondary school, a student reaches at the threshold of career development. So, a career Guidance and counselling cell has been established in the college to provide the guidance and proper counselling to the students regarding their future prospects and career, vitally taking their qualification and interest into account. Information related to job avenues is also displayed on the notice board from time to time. There is separate notice board for admission and job alerts.

12. **Sports Activities**

The college provides facilities to those who wish to make a mark in sports. College sends team for various University Championships like Athletics, Chess, Volleyball, Table Tennis, Badminton, Kabaddi, Basketball and Weight lifting (M/W). No student can play for an outside team without the written permission of the Principal. Annual Athletic Meet of the college is also another opportunity for the students to show their calibre and excellence in Athletics and Sports.

13. **Cultural Activities**

As we know that in our country there is a diversity of culture and perpetually needs to be grown and develop. Thus, the institution also provides a platform to students to show their talent through various cultural activities at H.P.U. Youth Festival, Inter College and Intra College Competition. They get a chance to participate in Debate, declamation, poetic recitation, elocution, quiz, drama, skit, mime, group dance, light vocal etc.

Note: *Prior permission of parents and concerned subject teacher is required for participating in any outdoor activity, H.P.U. Youth Festival and Inter College competitions.*

14. **PTA**

The PTA is a formal organization to strengthen the role parents in the institution for the betterment of their wards and also to protect their interests. Parents of students contribute towards PTA fund at the time of admission.

15. **Compendium – Our Quarterly E-newsletter**

Compendium is our college's official quarterly e-newsletter launched in October 2024. It is designed to keep students, faculty, and stakeholders informed and engaged. Each edition highlights key initiatives, academic achievements, extracurricular activities, workshops, and events conducted over the past three months. Compendium serves as a vibrant chronicle

of campus life, offering a comprehensive overview of the college's dynamic environment and ongoing pursuit of excellence.

16. Educational Tours

- (a) Educational tours are also arranged for students during the winter vacation. The routes will be recommended by the concerned committee and approved by the Principal.
- (b) For each tour, Teacher in-charge fixes itinerary (A plan of journey) with other members of the committee.
- (c) The college provides limited financial support as permitted under rules.
- (d) Students will have to produce written permission from their parents for joining such tours.

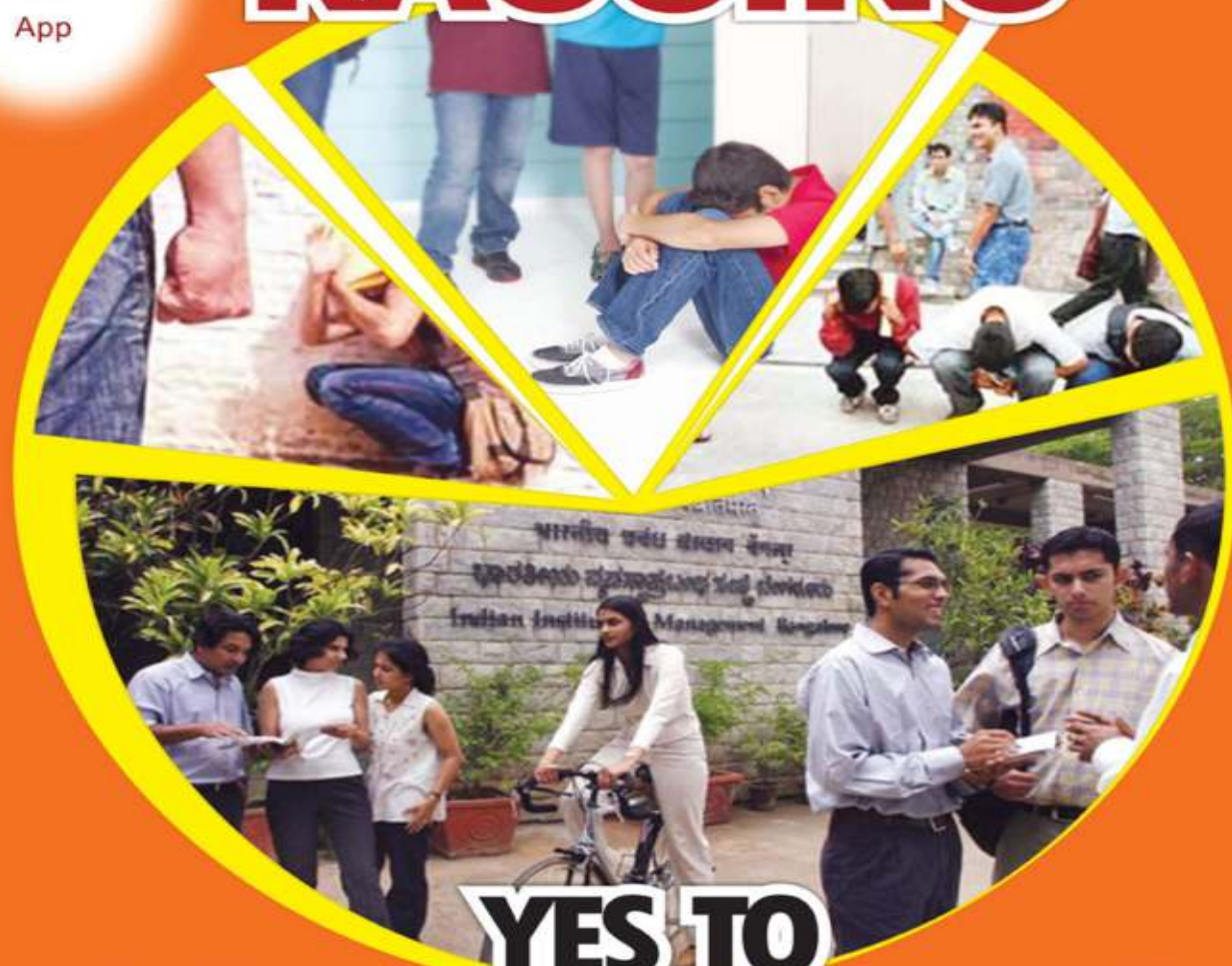

- Cancellation of admission.

- Withholding/withdrawing Scholarship/Fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament or youth festival etc.
- **Collective punishment** : when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on potential ragger.

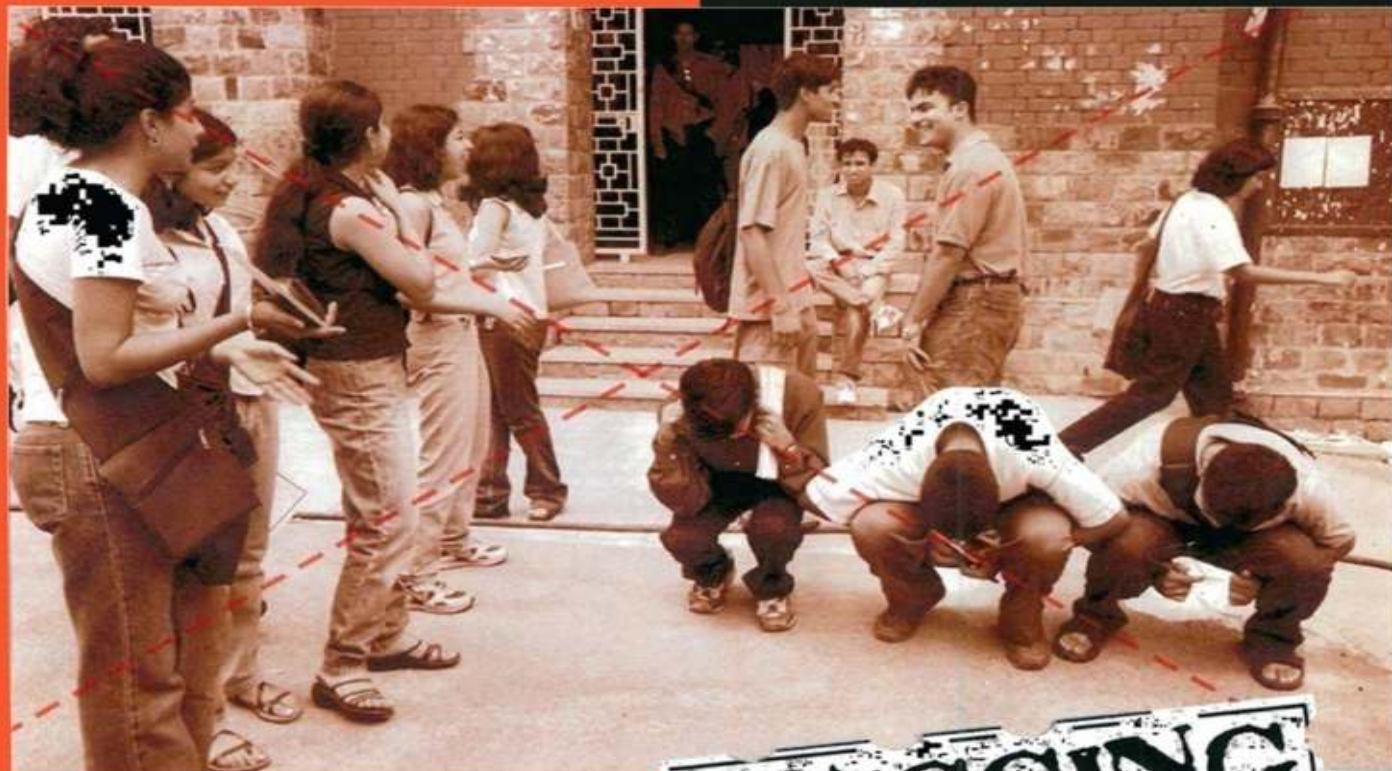
